



In 1620, it took the Pilgrims more than nine weeks to cross the Atlantic in the *Mayflower*.



In 1927, Charles Lindbergh flew from New York to Paris in 33 hours.







During World War I, in 1917, a revolution took place in Russia. The czar was arrested, forced from his throne, and later executed.



A constitutional democracy was set up, but was overthrown by the extreme revolutionists, and Vladimir Lenin became premier.





